## AMERICAN ACADEMY OF ORAL PATHOLOGY

Dr. Joseph A. Jachimezyk will give the annual Helen McLain lecture, entitled "Identification of the Living and the Dead," at the Academy's annual meeting, which will be held in Boston, Massachusetts, April 16 to 19, 1969. Dr. Jachimezyk is Chief Medical Examiner, Harris County, Houston, Texas; Chairman, Department of Forensic Pathology at the University of Texas School of Biologic Diseases; Senior Consultant in Pathology for the M. D. Anderson Tumor Institute; and holds academic appointments at Baylor University Medical School, University of Texas Dental School, University of Texas Law School, etc. His research interests include dental identification, correlation of fatal injuries to automotive de-

sign, antemortem versus postmortem injuries, when is death, investigation of cause of death in the heartless corpse, and the proof of pathology and the pathology of proof.

The rest of the program includes papers on forensic dentistry, infectious diseases, dystrophies, experimental pathology, clinical pathology, neoplasms, and diagnostic problems. Dr. Barnet Levy is preparing the program.

### **UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA**

A program of 1 to 3 years' duration in general and oral pathology will be available beginning July 1, 1969, in the hospital at the University of Pennsylvania under the direction of Drs. Lionel Gold, Ashley Brown, and Horatio T. Entrline, as well as the faculty of the Medical School of the University of Pennsylvania. The basic stipend will be approximately \$6,000.00. The program will be acceptable for board accreditation in oral pathology.
