AMERICAN ACADEMY OF ORAL MEDICINE

The American Academy of Oral Medicine will hold its semiannual meeting Nov. 30 to Dec. 2, 1979, at the Key Bridge Marriott Hotel in Washington, D. C. The medically compromised dental patient will be discussed by noted authorities on cancer and cardiovascular, kidney, and joint diseases. Emphasis will be placed on the dental implications and treatment necessary for optional interdisciplinary management.

UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON

The University of Washington is accepting applications for its postdoctoral program in oral medicine. The 24-month program leads to either a certificate or Master of Science in Dentistry degree. Financial support is usually available to those accepted into the program.

The chief objective of the program is to train clinicians and educators in the clinical discipline of oral medicine. The program consists of didactic courses, clinical oral medicine, rotations through related disciplines of medicine, and an acceptable research project if the M.S.D. program is selected.
